

**BOY SCOUT TROOP 728**  
**ST. PAUL THE APOSTLE PARISH**  
**PROVISIONAL RULES**

These are the provisional rules of Boy Scout Troop 728 (the “Troop”), an organization chartered by St. Paul the Apostle Parish. They are established through vote of the Troop Committee, supplement the official Bylaws, and are a compendium of current rules established by the Committee and recorded in the Minutes.

1. Dues for members of the Troop are fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per month.
2. Any expenses incurred on behalf of the Troop by any individual Scouter (without the approval of another registered Scouter) must be pre-approved by the Committee Chair, excepting only routine maintenance expenses incurred by the Troop Adult Quartermaster.
3. The Troop will reimburse Scouts for 100% of the “early bird” fee for attending the Oak Leaf Training course, and 50% of the “early bird” cost of attending the NYLT (National Youth Leadership Training) training course, upon proof of successful completion provided to the Treasurer by the Scout. Adult and other training expenses will be reimbursed at the discretion of the Committee.
4. Any reimbursements to Scouts or Scouters for expenses, fees, supplies, or training will only be made after all outstanding dues, camp fees, or any other amounts owed to the Troop have been offset.
5. At the troop meeting prior to the monthly campout, cash will be given to each patrol’s grubmaster, in exchange for a signed receipt, by the Treasurer to purchase food. Each patrol grubmaster can spend to \$12 per patrol member attending. This covers the Friday night snack (“cracker barrel”), three meals on Saturday, and an easy breakfast for Sunday. Any Scout who has signed up and cannot attend must notify his patrol leader 48 hours prior to departure to avoid being charged for his share of the food. Receipts, an attendance report, and any left over cash must be returned to the Treasurer by each patrol grubmaster at the next meeting.

6. The Troop Camping Coordinator (Outdoor/Activities Coordinator) is to inform the troop prior to each campout of the name and mobile telephone number of a designated adult to contact in case a parent must contact a Scout while on the campout. That designated adult is required to keep his or her telephone on and accessible at all times during the campout and during travel to and from the campout, subject to cellular coverage limitations.
